

ADJECTIVES

Definition

An adjective is a word that describes or modifies a noun or a pronoun. Adjectives are typically placed before the noun they are describing.



- 1. The school has a <u>beautiful</u> garden.
- 2. The **short** boy cannot jump very high.
- 3. Tom bought a white shirt.
- 4. I like the <u>big</u> houses with <u>large</u> yards.
- 5. The weather is **hot** today.

VERBS

Definition

A verb is a word that describes an action or occurrence. Verbs are used in all languages, and they are arguably the most important part of speech.




- 1. The kids are <u>playing</u> in the park.

NOUNS

Definition

A noun is a person, place, thing, or idea. Nouns can be singular (there's one) or plural (there are more than one).



- 1. The **boy** threw a **ball** into the **lake**.
- 2. She ate <u>apples</u>.
- 3. I drink many <u>glasses</u> of <u>milk</u> every day.
- 4. Jimmy went to the park.
- 5. Anna drove a car.

PRONOUNS

Definition

A pronoun is a word that stands in for a noun. Pronouns are used in place of nouns. It's used to avoid repeating a noun every time it appears in a sentence.

CONJUNCTIONS

Definition

A conjunction is a word or group of words that connects words, phrases and clauses.

Examples

- 1. I like apples, <u>but</u> I don't like bananas.
- 2. He went to the market <u>and</u> bought some milk.
- 3. I love pizza <u>because</u> it is delicious.
- 4.1 have a lot of work today, <u>so</u> I will not have time to play with you.

INTERJECTIONS

Definition

Interjections are words or short phrases that express strong emotions, like surprise, joy, sorrow, disgust and anger.

Wow!	Oh!	Yay!
Alas!	Ugh!	Ahem!

- 1. Wow! What a beautiful baby.
- 2. Oh no! I forgot my homework again!
- 3. Ah! I'm glad you're home safe now.
- 4. Yes! I cried joyfully.
- 5. Ouch! That hurts!

PREPOSITION

Definition

Prepositions are words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in the sentence.







- 1. He drives to work.
- 2. He was standing <u>near</u> his car.
- 3. She is happy <u>about</u> her promotion.
- 4. The boy was angry <u>at</u> the girl.
- 5. The dog is **behind** him.
