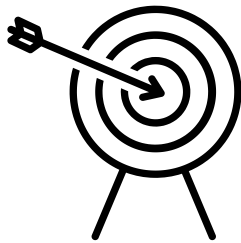


# ADVERBS

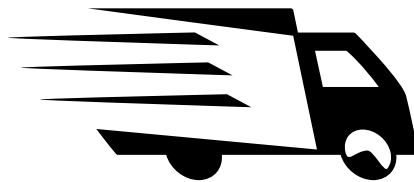
## Definition

Adverbs are words that modify verbs (or action words), but they can also modify adjectives, or other adverbs.

## Examples

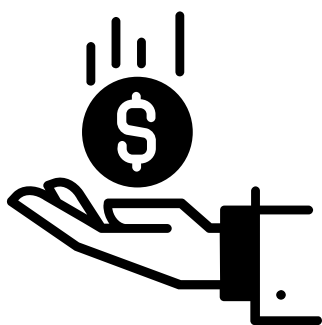
1. She sang beautifully.
2. She ate apples eagerly.
3. Tom is answering the questions quickly.
4. He performed duty honestly.
5. Anna talks nervously.

# ADJECTIVES

## Definition

An adjective is a word that describes or modifies a noun or a pronoun. Adjectives are typically placed before the noun they are describing.

## Examples

1. The school has a beautiful garden.
2. The short boy cannot jump very high.
3. Tom bought a white shirt.
4. I like the big houses with large yards.
5. The weather is hot today.

# VERBS

## Definition

A verb is a word that describes an action or occurrence. Verbs are used in all languages, and they are arguably the most important part of speech.

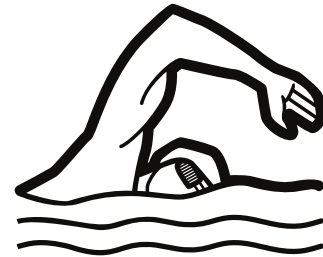

## Examples

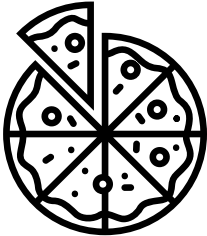
1. The kids are playing in the park.

# NOUNS

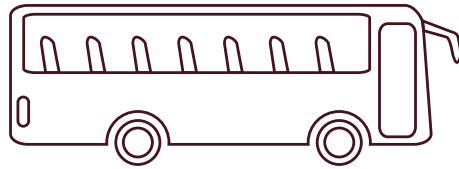
## Definition

A noun is a person, place, thing, or idea. Nouns can be singular (there's one) or plural (there are more than one).

1. The boy threw a ball into the lake.
2. She ate apples.
3. I drink many glasses of milk every day.
4. Jimmy went to the park.
5. Anna drove a car.

# PRONOUNS

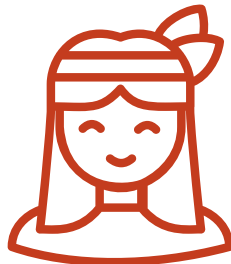
## Definition

A pronoun is a word that stands in for a noun. Pronouns are used in place of nouns. It's used to avoid repeating a noun every time it appears in a sentence.

**He**



**She**



**They**



## Examples

1. She is moving to Paris next month.
2. They are planning for a tour.
3. I take exercise daily.
4. Apples are good for you.
5. It is raining outside.

# CONJUNCTIONS

## Definition

A conjunction is a word or group of words that connects words, phrases and clauses.

**Either/or**

## Examples

1. I like apples, but I don't like bananas.
2. He went to the market and bought some milk.
3. I love pizza because it is delicious.
4. I have a lot of work today, so I will not have time to play with you.

# INTERJECTIONS

## Definition

Interjections are words or short phrases that express strong emotions, like surprise, joy, sorrow, disgust and anger.

**Wow!**

**Oh!**

**Yay!**

**Alas!**

**Ugh!**

**Ahem!**

## Examples

1. Wow! What a beautiful baby.
2. Oh no! I forgot my homework again!
3. Ah! I'm glad you're home safe now.
4. Yes! I cried joyfully.
5. Ouch! That hurts!

# PREPOSITION

## Definition

Prepositions are words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in the sentence.
