COMMON NOUNS

Denotes a general or common person or thing.

Examples

- Book
- Boy
- Chair

PROPER NOUNS

personal name of a place, person, or thing.

Examples

- John
- London
- Germany

COLLECTIVE NOUNS

Persons or things taken together and spoken of as one whole.

Examples

- Faculty
- Herd
- Crowd

ABSTRACT NOUNS

Denotes some quality, state or action.

Examples

- Truth
- Honesty
- Pleasure

MATERIAL NOUNS

Names given to the material things (made of matter).

Examples

- Mud
- Sugar
- Gold

COUNTABLE NOUNS

The names of objects, people, etc. that we can count.

Examples

- Balls
- Students
- Computers

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Common things that cannot be counted.

Examples

- Machinery
- Knowledge
- Sand

REGULAR NOUNS

Nouns that become plurals by adding 's' are called regular nouns.

Examples

- Girl - Girls
- Axe - Axes
- Animal-Animals

IRREGULAR NOUNS

Spellings of these nouns are changed when become plurals.

Examples

- Fox - Foxes
- Enemy-Enemies
- Lady - Ladies

PLURAL NOUNS

Denotes more than one person, place or thing.

Examples

- Friends
- Men
- Trees

POSSESSIVE NOUNS

A possessive noun shows ownership.

Examples

- Tom's bike
- Egg's color
- Jane's diary
