



# PRONOUNS CHART

The words used in place of nouns or noun phrase are called pronouns.

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## PERSONAL PRONOUN

It is used in place of person's name.

### Example

Tom is smart boy.

**He** is also very intelligent.

## POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

Possessive pronouns shows the ownership in the sentence.

### Examples

Your dress is not as beautiful as **mine**.

## INTERROGATIVE PRONOUN

Interrogative pronoun is used to ask questions.

### Examples

**Whom** did they invite?

## RELATIVE PRONOUN

Relative pronoun introduces a clause in the sentence.

### Examples

I met a man **who** is my neighbor.

## DISTRIBUTIVE PRONOUN

It denotes as to whether things are mentioned collectively or separately in a sentence.

### Examples

**Each** of the students got a scholarship.

## DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUN

It demonstrates already mentioned noun in the sentence.

### Examples

**That** is Tom's book.

## REFLEXIVE PRONOUN

Reflexive pronoun is made by adding 'self' or 'selves' to a personal pronoun.

### Examples

He punished **himself** for his mistake.

## INDEFINITE PRONOUN

Refers to people or things without saying exactly who or what they are.

### Examples

**None** of the three boys has got back his ticket.

## EMPHATIC PRONOUN

These are used to show stress and emphasis in a sentence.

### Examples

We blame **ourselves** for the result of the election.

## EXCLAMATORY PRONOUN

It expresses wonder to surprise element in the sentence.

### Examples

What a lovely picture is it!

## POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

The quantifier pronoun shows the quantity of something.

### Examples

There is **much** water in the pond.

## INDEFINITE PRONOUN

Reciprocal pronoun used to talk about the mutual relationship.

### Examples

We should cooperate with **one another**.
